

FLOODA book by Victoria Cooper

The Shoalhaven River has a long history of floods that redefine the landscape and the human occupation within that region.

During an artist-in-residence at Arthur Boyd's Bundanon, there were a series of significant storms and rain events leading to very high river levels and treacherous river flows. Although after each event the river returned to a calmer flow, the riverine environment was upturned and changed – an epic and continuing cycle of loss and regeneration over the eons.

When creating *Flood*, I reflected on how these natural rhythms of the river can also echo the everyday human experience during times of personal and social upheaval.

Found natural materials from the banks of the Shoalhaven River were utilised to create multi layered cyanotype photograms. These were made 'on-site' at Bundanon during periods of calmer sunny weather. The hand-set type was also stamped during this residency.

I chose the form of the concertina book as it creates an expanded and three-dimensional flow for the visual narrative rather than the conventional page turn of the codex.
